#### INDUCTION

#### Pupil Leadership Training Programme

Our P3-P5 Prefects and P5 CCA Leaders participated in a 4-day Pupil Leadership Training Programme through Zoom in February to help them grow into Peer Educators, Pupil Advocates, and Change Makers.

P3	Learned to care for animals and design postcards to raise awareness on animal abuses.
P4	Learned to guide Primary One buddies on keeping the school environment clean by designing class posters for them.
P5	Learned to share the knowledge of vampire power with the seniors by designing Vampire Cards for them.
P6	Learned to share the knowledge of healthy eating with the seniors by creating Healthy Recipe cards for them.

In Semester 1, our pupils had their lessons on CCE Stories. The lessons helped pupils to strengthen their values of R3ICH: Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Integrity, Care and Harmony.

#### **DESIGN AND INNOVATION WORKSHOP**

Westwood Primary organized several Design & Innovation Workshops for P1 to P4 pupils at the beginning of Term 2. These workshops were implemented to engage pupils in building up their creative and design thinking skills. For the Lower Primary pupils, participants learned to use Strawbees and straws to create shapes and structures. The P2 pupils had the opportunity to enhance their learning by incorporating Quirkbots and coding to make their structures move. Both levels worked on

In the Middle Primary level, the main focus would be for pupils to have a close relationship with their peers. As such, our THRIVE lessons focus on peer relationship and teamwork. Westwoodians in the Middle Primary are given many opportunities to prepare themselves for life as we anchor our programmes based on our Character Strengths to help them develop learning dispositions and future skills as well as grow in areas they are passionate about.

With our committed staff, we would enable each and every child to excel to greater heights.

#### P3 AND P4 ORFF MODULES

Through the Orff Level 1 and 2 modules, the P3 and 4 pupils learnt musical concepts and developed ensemble-playing skills through singing, chanting, movement and the playing of pitched percussion instruments. Improvisation, composition and a child's natural sense of play are encouraged in a classroom environment where children are not inhibited by the fear of failing.

#### **P4 PROJECT WORK**

Our P4 pupils embarked on their ICT Baseline cum Project Work during their 21CC lessons in Term 1 and Term 2. Pupils were taught basic coding skills which enabled them to integrate Micro:bits into their prototype, turning their prototype into a digital product. Anchored on the theme 'Passion for Community' and aligning it to our ALP Positive Design Framework, the pupils eventually came up with a Micro:bit carnival game prototype that could meet the needs and improve the lives of a targeted community.






## POSITIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OUR PRIDE AND JOY
