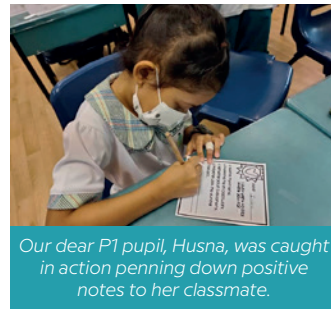

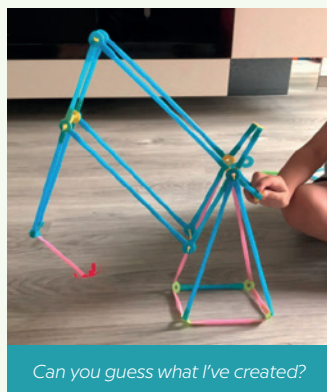

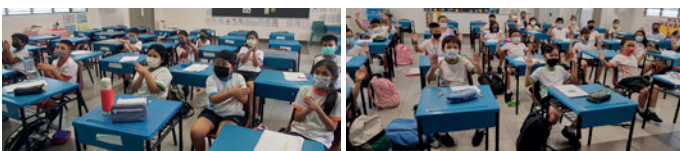

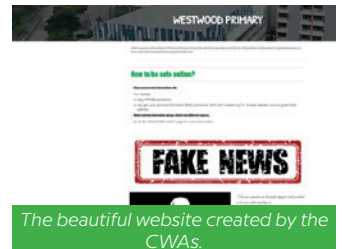

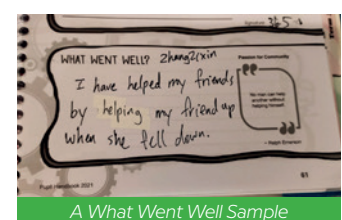

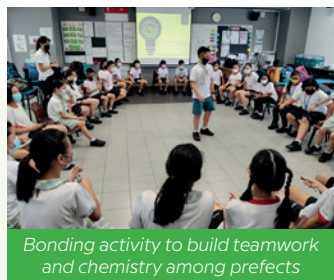

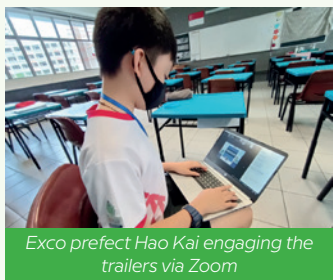

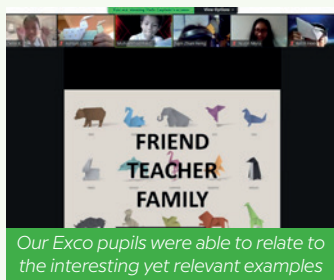


Bonding activity to build teamwork and chemistry among prefects

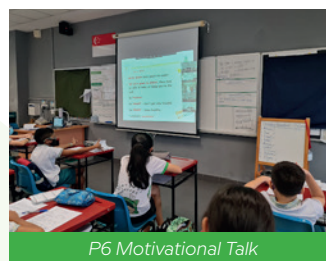

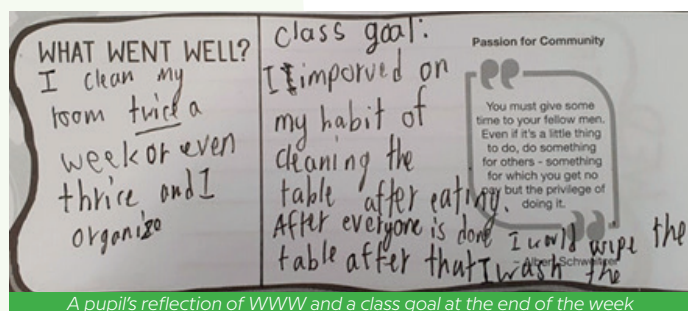


P6 Motivational Talk

In Term 3, P6 pupils were given a series of motivational talks on goal-setting, time management, and strategies for better coping with pressure during the morning THRIVE lessons. Useful strategies such as how to take mindful breaks, and how to draw up a study schedule were shared with the pupils. Mr Mah, our principal, personally took them through the various sessions and engaged the pupils in thinking about their aspirations, goals, and how to take positive actions in order to achieve them.

What Went Well

The school conducts regular "What Went Well" (WWW) moments in the classroom on Fridays for pupils to reflect and write about a "What Went Well" moment in the week. Teachers will also share their personal WWW moments with pupils. By constantly getting pupils and staff to reflect upon WWW moments, the process leads staff and pupils to think about positive memories which in turn lead to emotions of positivity, establishing a better teacher-student relationship, and leading on to a positive learning environment.

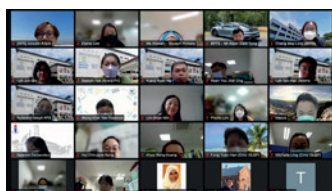

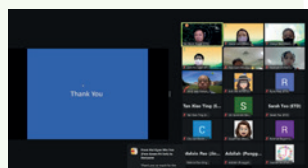
2021 Creative Writing Programme
